"You know, the creek didn't always look like it does today," Grandma tells Christina, as they dig.


"When houses were first built in South City, people wanted to stop the heavy rain waters, so they covered up the beautiful creek with hard, grey concrete. People didn't play here at all."


"Sometimes the water smelled so bad we had to hold our noses! None of the lovely little creatures that are here now lived here then."




"But the people of South City didn't like all the hard, grey concrete. So we decided to change it back to how it had been like long, long ago...




We planted new homes for fish and other critters. We wanted to be able to get up close to the water and watch when the water dances over the rocks and plants...

"We did it together... My mom, your mom, you, me, and the whole South City community. Just like we're doing right now, Christina."




"Someday you'll be able to bring your family and friends to Colma Creek.


